Facilities include 8 sunny art studios, two ceramics rooms, a kiln room, a photo lab, a printmaking studio with 3 presses, student galleries, a children's book illustration gallery and access to the Danforth Museum's 9 galleries of changing exhibitions. All of our second floor studios are AIR CONDITIONED, and there is convenient FREE PARKING in the Danforth lot and in the adjacent lot on Lexington Street.

The Danforth School of Art offers art classes for everyone - regardless of experience. From absolute beginners to established artists with advanced degrees, students find the opportunity to learn from art professionals, as well as from other students. The Danforth School of Art is THE place to learn to draw for both adults and children! There are excellent teachers and many new offerings for adults, and the Danforth is developing new observational drawing techniques for children in grades 2 through 8. A drawing or painting class for each level will be available throughout the year to continue a "spiral of learning", where students will be able to build upon their past experiences, pairing observation with imagination in a creative studio setting.
